Both events were led by outstanding committees and helped the NCCAA in making new friends.

Brown's Run Country Club hosted the Middletown event. The committee of Dr. David Miller, Rev. Barry Shafer, Dr. Scott True, and John and Jody Wheeler implemented an outstanding one-day golf outing and secured sponsors. Special thanks also go to Angie Miller, Kyle & Dianna Bloom, and Dr. Gary & Lisa Cobb for assisting with the details of this outing. We were able to share the message of the NCCAA with the 17 foursomes that participated. We also had foursomes from four of our member institutions play in the tournament: Cedarville University, Geneva College, Indiana Wesleyan University, and Ohio Christian University. Cedarville University also provided student-athletes to serve as volunteers.

October brought 25 teams to the 2nd annual Mission Possible golf outing at Bright's Creek Golf Club in Mill Spring, NC. Many of the participants were first timers to any NCCAA outing while many others were returners from last year's event. We are thankful to the committee of John Claudepierre, John Galliard, Tom Hancock, Darin MacDonald, Mike Pereyo, John Saunders, Brad Skelton, Brian Todd, Grover Todd, and Steve Wolverton for their time and efforts in making this event another success. Volunteers for this tournament were Joyce Bridges, Ginger Clamp and Tom Dodgen along with the men's and women's golf teams of North Greenville University.

The amateurs who played in the tournaments were introduced to the NCCAA and our ministry. It was a time to share the great things happening on our member campuses, at our championships, and through our Christian Service Projects (CSPs) and missions funding.

The inaugural Ohio Mission Possible Classic winners were the team representing Geneva College with a score of 121: Alan Sumner, Jeff Santarseiro, Brian Yowler, and Joe Jurinko. North Carolina Mission Possible Classic trophies went to Todd Henley, Steve Wolverton, Shane Wolverton, and Bill Silva with a score of 119. Capping the days' awards were drawings for a complimentary couple's entry (\$2,975 value) into the 2011 NCCAA Pro-Am, which was won by Bill Barlage in NC and Darren Dulsky in OH, then a complimentary entry (\$7,500 value) into the 2011 Nationwide Tour's BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by Synnex, was won by John Saunders in NC.

The big winner was the NCCAA as over \$29,000 was raised at these two events and many new friendships for the association were developed. Plans are already underway for these tournaments next fall as the tournament committees look to the future. More information will be available next summer.

Sports and Faith: Allies or Adversaries?

There once was a little boy who badly wanted to be a professional basketball player. In the extreme heat and humidity of an Iowa summer he would shoot baskets, practice moves, and dream of the game winning shot all while roasting on the hot, cracked and uneven blacktop of his driveway. The hoop was not official regulation in its height and the backboard was peeling and cracked, but this was his "home court". As the seasons changed and winter set in, he would put on the parka and gloves, shovel the driveway, turn on the outdoor floodlight, and shoot baskets until his mom would make him come back inside for some hot chocolate. His desire to someday be in the NBA along with his enjoyment of the game drove him to practice, try new moves, and learn what dedication meant. Unfortunately for him, he ended up being "vertically challenged" and his competitive basketball playing days ended upon high school graduation.

As you probably have figured out, that little boy was me. While my dream of the NBA faded with the realization that the growth chart couldn't be bribed, what I learned from the participation in sports was more valuable. You see I have played, coached, and supervised sports teams from little league to NCAA varsity programs. And while I believe that there are aspects of sports in today's society that are not in

line with what we should value and expect, I do believe that sports can be an integral part of the spiritual growth of an athlete.

Sport in itself is not good or bad; it doesn't have the ability to determine an outcome. It is the people that participate in sports that determine the usefulness of sport. Coaches and players that decide that sport is the medium to learn, teach, and practice life lessons are the ones using it for the betterment of the individuals, all the while learning how to function together in a team setting with team goals. On the flip side, selfishness, pride, and personal gain can also be the result of participation in sports, all determined by the individual(s) who are involved.

In his blog, Roger Lipe, Southern Illinois Fellowship of Christian Athletes Representative, parallels the participation in sports with worship. He writes, "We, who identify ourselves as coaches and athletes, have rich opportunities for holy, pleasing and spiritual worship as we train and compete. Our daily activities in sport are perfectly pleasing to our Lord as we dedicate ourselves to Him in loving service."¹ He goes on to add, "All of life is our spiritual act of worship, holy and acceptable to God as we offer our bodies as living

sacrifices thereby practicing the presence of our Living Lord through our lives in sport.”¹ Lipe is referring to Romans 12:1 which states, “Therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, I urge you to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God; this is your spiritual worship.” You see, all that we do can be a form of worship, sport included.

Recently the volleyball team at Northwestern College decided to practice a virtue that they were studying: integrity as it relates to worship. In all aspects of their lives they wanted to practice integrity, including on the court of competition. The result of this undertaking was to make “honor calls”, which is informing the official when you touch the ball at the net but the official does not see it, thus awarding you the point. These honor calls cost your team points. Most of America would say you are crazy, it is the official’s job to make the call. As a matter of fact, as displayed by a recent Major League Baseball player, they would tell you to sell it the other way, to try and influence the official in o giving you the point, even if you didn’t earn it.

Because of this decision, our women’s volleyball team gave back 30 points that they did not earn. But they earned hundreds of “points” with the opposing teams, fans, and community. We received many calls about what we were doing, saying it was “refreshing” to hear that a team would actually do this. This goes back to the original thought – it is not sport that is an ally or adversary, it is the people that



participate in sport. They are the ones that choose to determine the path sport will take, the experience it will be, and how it can be used.

One of the most popular passages in the Bible references an athletic event, a race. Philippians 3:14 says, “I press on to reach the end of the race and receive the heavenly prize for which God, through Christ Jesus, is calling us.”³ Paul references life here as a race, focused on the goal, the heavenly prize. With the right perspective, the right focus, the right mindset, sports can be an ally – a conduit to growing, practicing, and living out your faith, staying focused on the heavenly prize. Along with the presentation of our lives as a living sacrifice to God (Rom. 12:1) and committing everything we do for God’s glory (Col. 3:23), sports can be used to grow one’s faith and further God’s kingdom.

That is what I appreciate about the mission of the athletic program at Northwestern College: ...to utilize sports as the conduit for spiritual, educational, social and athletic growth of our student-athletes, encouraging them to maximize all their gifts. That is how our student athletes, as individuals on a team, will use sport to grow in all areas of their lives. Using sport as an “ally” along their faith journey.
