

Where is Our Focus?

Last month, I attended the funeral and life celebration for a friend and donor of the NCCAA, Bob Mannes. Bob had been a supporter of this association and a dear friend for over 20 years. Never one to miss an opportunity for a joke, his favorite welcome was, "My name is BOB, whether forward or backwards." He would call me every 30 days and simply ask, "So what is the big deal today?"

At his service, Pastor Bill Boersma shared Luke 9:51-53, which states in the King James Version:

⁵¹And it came to pass, when the time was come that he should be received up, he steadfastly set his face to go to Jerusalem,

⁵²And sent messengers before his face: and they went, and entered into a village of the Samaritans, to make ready for him.

⁵³And they did not receive him, because his face was as though he would go to Jerusalem.

Pastor Boersma challenged each of us to check the target on which we are focused. As I visited with family and friends after the service and then drove to Grand Rapids for the return flight, I kept hearing that challenge. Now, several weeks after the fact, that question has become a daily reminder that we, as Christians, are not to be focused on this world's goals and aspirations. As a disciple of Jesus Christ, WHERE I am going is settled, but HOW I live on the journey is daily determined by my focal point.

I often describe the diversity of our 104 member institutions by stating that they all begin their mission at the foot of the cross. I hope we all remember that the cross is what launches our journey of faith but it is not where our focus belongs.

As we begin our journey, we must have some destination point that draws our attention when we can so easily waiver onto detours along the way. Should that

be our heavenly home? After all, Paul was striving for the prize set before him. Should it be a legacy of faith left behind once we have passed on? I certainly saw such a legacy through the Mannes family and their children and grandchildren.

May I offer another option? One of the definitions of focus is *a point at which light rays converge* (Webster's). Is that the answer then? Should my focus be a point where all light rays converge? If that LIGHT is Jesus Christ, the Light of the world per John 8:12, then a better definition cannot be given! You and I (and all Christians) should live our lives so that everything we do brings attention to the point where all LIGHT converges, which is in the person our of Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. As difficult as it may be, everything I do, and how I do it, should be targeted toward bringing people to Christ.

May 2012 be a year of great focus for you, me and this association as we face the challenges and opportunities before us. May we all point others to Him through having our faces set on the Savior!

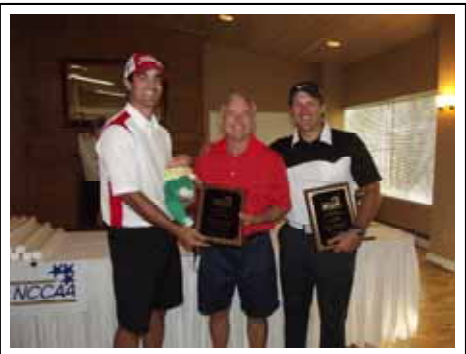

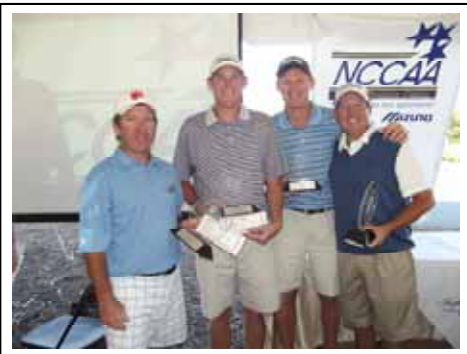
The amateurs who played in the tournaments were introduced to the NCCAA and our ministry. It was a time to share the great things happening on our member campuses, at our championships, and through our Christian Service Projects (CSPs) and missions funding.

The Ohio Mission Possible Classic winners were the team of R.J. Beucler, Joe Clark, Michael Kinzie, and Gary Huffman with a score of 118. North Carolina Mission Possible Classic trophies went to Brian Todd, Jeff Ware, Daniel Bowden and Jonathan Bowden with a score of 119. Capping the days' awards were drawings for a complimentary couple's entry (\$3,140 value) into the 2012 NCCAA Pro-Am, which was won by Alan Corbin in NC and Mark Davis in OH, and a complimentary entry (\$7,500 value) into the 2012 Nationwide Tour's BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by Synnex, was won by Julio Samayoia in NC.

The big winner was the NCCAA as over \$31,600 was raised at these two events and many new friendships for the association were developed. Plans are already underway for these tournaments next fall as the tournament committees look to the future. More information will be available next summer.

Student-Athletes Give During Championships

The NCCAA continues to impact families and communities nationwide. So far this school year (September - December, 2011), NCCAA student-athletes, coaches and staff have already collected and donated over 5,000 pounds of food, 1,000 pounds of clothes, over \$2,000 cash, fed over 100,000 people, donated 165 pairs of shoes, 600 pairs of socks and 430 toys, PLUS conducted free sport clinics, visited nursing homes and schools, ministered in inner cities, helped tornado victims, and donated gift bags to people in need! Reports have been received of the overwhelming encouragement these donations have been. Thank you to all the member institutions who have helped make this outreach possible. Our goal is to donate 11,000 pounds of food this school year so we are off to a great start!

Annually, NCCAA staff, student-athletes and coaches perform approximately 6,500 hours of Christian outreach at NCCAA National Championships! Over the years, approximately 6,250 NCCAA student-athletes and coaches have received NCCAA funding for sports ministry trips worldwide. Lives are being changed! 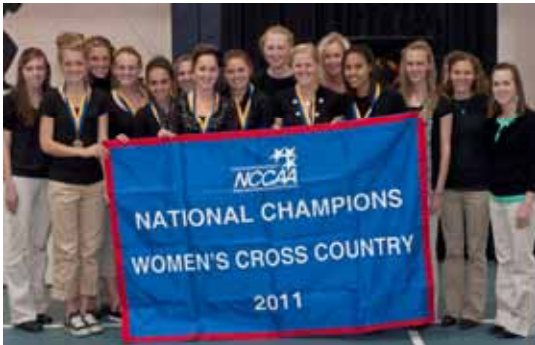

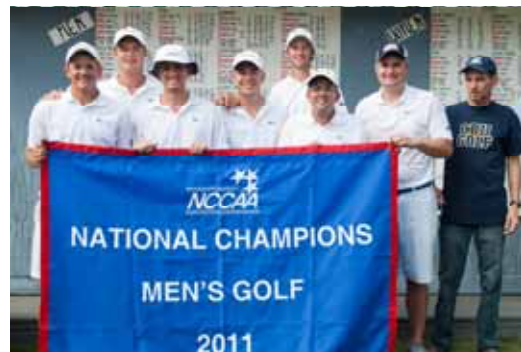

Shining Stars

Light the way, our slogan here at Northwestern College. Ever thought of that in a deep perspective? I have recently. What a great calling for all of us involved with young people.

I would like to challenge us to be shining stars, to light the way. Not the way the world defines stars, but as God defines stars in Philippians 2:15. You are here today because you have been given a great responsibility – the calling to coach/teach/lead people. God calls us to use all the talents he has entrusted to us for His glory. Be a shining star!

Have you ever been to the Hollywood Walk of Fame? Stars such as John Lennon, Steve Martin, Ray Ramono, Vanna White, Jerry Sienfeld, and 600 more are honored with stars in the sidewalk along Hollywood Boulevard. Movie stars, game show hosts, radio stars, soap opera stars, and others are cemented in time with millions of people walking by them each month. To the world, these are the heroes, the stars. Many of these people are honorable individuals, but they are not honored there for their work for the kingdom of God.

Let's take a different perspective of what a star is. Physical stars in the sky differ widely in mass, size, temperature, and total energy output, or luminosity. The sun, a typical star, has a surface temperature of about 6,000°C - molten rock, or liquid rock (lava) is approximately 1200°C. The most luminous stars are about a million times more powerful than the sun. The largest stars, are hundreds of times greater in size than the sun and have a surface temperature of approximately 20,000°C; if one

were placed at the sun's position, it would incinerate the entire earth in less than 5 minutes.

I believe Paul used the words shining stars, or in some versions, luminaries, bright light, to describe how we should act because of the characteristics of a star. It is bright, on fire, and powerful.

Read Philippians 2:1-15, which calls us to be lights in this world, to shine as stars:

¹⁴Do everything without complaining or arguing, ¹⁵so that you may become blameless and pure, children of God without fault in a crooked and depraved generation, in which you **shine like stars in the universe.**

If you draw a star you most likely will draw it with 5 points. So what five points make up a godly shining star according to Philippians 2?

- Humility
- Obedience
- Unity - Being like-minded
- Selflessness - nothing out of personal gain
- Service – Action for the kingdom

Radiate warmth, be on fire for Jesus, be like the sun, something that people look forward to seeing everyday.
