- VOTE: The vote for Southeastern University to be dual affiliated among D-I and D-II in the 2009-10 academic year was voted against, 1 in favor, 4 against, and 9 abstained.**
 - In communication with Dan Woods about the vote he advised that we have a re-vote, he was concerned about 9 members abstaining from a vote.
 - The National Office communicated that they do not like the language that this is a D-II issue, they would like to see the D-I institutions find their voice on this issue.

- 11) Athletes transferring within the region, D-II concern raised by Alan Wilson, Atlanta Christian
- Discussion was to locate the NCCAA Release Form, before developing one for the region. It was communicated that it might be located in the D-I handbook and not in the D-II handbook as many of the D-II AD's were having trouble locating the Release Form.
- 12) Rotation of hosting NCCAA South Region Tournaments, raised by Bob White, Palm Beach Atl.
- VOTE: Motioned by Bob White (Palm Beach Atlantic), seconded by Dennis Hesel (Chowan University) to establish an equal rotation for all members to have the opportunity to host each sport regional tournament in which they pay dues. The vote was unanimous, 15-0.**
 - Items which still need to be addressed;
 - If, when, and how an institution can opt out of hosting a regional tournament
 - The ability for institutions to defer hosting the regional tournament when it is their turn in the rotation which would send that institution to the bottom of the list and move the next institution into hosting.
 - New members go to the bottom of each region sport tournament rotation.
 - If majority of the members would prefer to have the region sport tournament at Location A for men's soccer which has 8 teams competing in the region however "American Christian University" does not elect to defer then it is possible that the region tournament would be at Location A for seven of the eight years with the other year it being at "American Christian University."
