ADMINISTRATIVE GUIDELINES FOR THE CENTRAL REGION

1. The regional meeting will be held the first Saturday following Labor Day in September. All schools are expected to have representation at this meeting. Failure to attend the meeting can result in penalties to that institution. (In lieu of this meeting, the Division I colleges and universities will have a regional meeting at the annual national meeting of the NCCAA. A phone conference of all Athletic Directors in September at a date to be specified by the chair will be held if there is any unfinished business that needs to be discussed.)

2. Eligibility forms are due to the respective eligibility officer for your specific division, prior to the first contest or scrimmage in that sport. For Division I, this officer is the Region Chair, Dr. Jerry Boone. If you are dually affiliated, just send the new Dually Affiliated National Eligibility declaration Form to Dr. Boone.
3. The regional dues are \$125 and are due by September 30, to the regional treasurer.
4. By August 1 of each year, all Athletic Directors need to send a roster of coaches to the Region Chair, Jerry Malone.

ADMINISTRATIVE GUIDELINES

I. OFFICES AND DUTIES

A. Region Chair (Division I)

1. The Regional Chair shall be elected by a vote of the regional athletic directors. The chair shall serve a three (3) year term.
2. Duties include:
 - a. Direct and administer NCCAA sports within the region.
 - b. In concert with the Director of Member Relations, screen applicants from prospective Regional colleges for NCCAA membership.
 - c. Serve on the National Administrative Council.
 - d. Develop unity among member institutions within the region.

- e. Represent the region at the NCCAA Annual Convention.
 - f. Not enter into any vendor contractual agreements without the permission of the NCCAA Executive Director.
 - g. Receive and record eligibility reports for their Division.
 - h. Publicize, administer, and moderate annual regional meetings and any special meetings.
 - i. Concurrently with each sport chair, oversee the operation of each regional tournament.
 - j. Serve as liaison to the National Office and Board of Directors (includes annual report).
 - k. Supply awards (championship banners, All-Central Regional & Coach of the Year certificates).
 - l. Assist with accumulation of regional sports information.
 - m. Chair the Executive Committee, which consists of all Athletic Directors and Sports Chairs.
 - n. Appoint members to the Executive Committee (Athletic Directors and Sports Chairs).
- B. Region Vice-Chair (Division II)
- 1. The Regional Vice-Chair shall be elected by a vote of the regional athletic directors. The Vice-Chair shall serve a three-(3) year term and then succeed to the Regional Chair for a three-(3) year term.
 - 2. Duties include:
 - a. Assist the Regional Chair in overall operation of Regional business.
 - b. Perform the duties of the Regional Chair in his/her absence.
 - c. Assist the Regional Chair in processing eligibility reports and regional meetings for their Division.
 - d. Oversee eligibility for the Division I or II, not overseen by the Regional Chair.
- C. Treasurer
- 1. Maintain regional treasury.
 - 2. Collect dues from member schools.
- D. Regional Sports Chair
- 1. The Sport Chair shall be elected by a vote of the respective coaches of each sport. The Sport Chair shall serve a three-(3) year term.
 - 2. Duties include:
 - a. Oversee and administer regional tournament. Approve a 5 year calendar.
 - b. Concurrently work with Regional Chair to determine eligibility of each team (regional dues and eligibility forms).
 - c. Concurrently work with National Sports Chair to communicate with regional coaches. Encourage participation at both the regional and national levels.
 - d. Serve as a representative at the national tournament.

- e. Arrange conference-call seeding meeting or coordinate seeding for tournaments.
- f. Serve on All-American and Scholar-Athlete Selection Committee and National Sports Committee at national meeting.
- g. Concurrently work with Sports Information Director to accumulate statistics throughout the year and select of All-Central Regional team.
- h. Provide a written report of the regional tournament to the Regional Chair for inclusion into the annual report.
- i. Be responsible for writing and updating the Region Handbook in relation to their particular sport.

II. ALL-REGION AWARDS

- A. The All-Region selection procedure is coordinated by the Sport Chair.
- B. Regional sports statistics - For each sport, the Sport Chair will issue statistical reports listing team statistics and standings, individual statistics, and game scores. These statistics are also to be communicated to the National Statistician. The appropriate forms will be sent out by the Sport Chair.
- C. Any coach who does not meet the specific deadlines of nomination will penalize him/her players who are of All-Region caliber.
- D. In order for a coach to be able to nominate players for any team, that school must be a member of the NCCAA in good standing. Regional and national dues must be paid.
- E. Participation in the regional tournament is not required for a school to be represented on the All-Region team.
- F. Participation in the regional statistical services is not required, but highly recommended. Each institution should strive to participate.
- G. Nomination Guidelines:
 - 1. Nomination procedures for All-Region Team will be administered by the Sports Chair and recommended as part of the Sports Guidelines.
 - 2. Coaches' nominations must appear in ranked order.
 - 3. A player must have played in half of the team's games at the time of the nomination in order to be eligible for nomination.

H. Voting Guidelines:

4. Vote in rank order - #1 best player, and so on. This procedure is important in tie-breaking.
5. Coaches may not vote for their own players.
6. All votes must be for players whose names are on the ballot. No write in votes.
7. Any specific criteria for voting is determined by respective sport.

The Region Sports Chair is responsible to mail two certificates per person following the announcement of the All-Central Region team. The presentation of the All-Central Region certificates and Coach of the Year certificates is to be done following the regional championship contest. The host school will be responsible to handle the awards presentation in the absence of the Region Sports Chair.

Coach of the Year:

8. The award is intended to honor a coach who has done "the best job" with his/her team throughout the season. It is up to each individual coach who votes to determine voting priority.
9. There is not a requirement for the team's record for that particular season, nor is there a requirement that the team participate in the regional tournament.
10. In the event of only two teams in the regional, the coach of the regional champion will automatically be named the Coach of the Year.
11. In the event that there is not a regional champion, there will not be a Coach of the Year award given that year in that sport.
12. Coaches will be asked to rank the coaches in 1-2-3 order on the ballot. In the case of a tie, the coach of the regional champion will be the Coach of the Year.

IV. ETHICS AND BEHAVIOR

Provide accurate information concerning all aspects of our athletic programs to the NCCAA and other public forums.

Ensure honesty and integrity when working with the campus personnel to recruit and retain student-athletes.

Treat all student-athletes equally and celebrate their diversity, regardless of gender, ethnicity or cultural background.

Instill in my student-athletes Godly character by demonstrating high standards of honesty and personal integrity while expecting the same from them. I will encourage spiritual growth in their walk with the Lord or attempt to lead them to a saving knowledge of Christ.

Put the needs, safety and protection of the student-athletes above winning or personal desires. I will strive to give balance to each individual as it relates to their performance and their spiritual, social, emotional, intellectual and physical well-being.

Develop independence in my student-athletes. Student-athletes must be encouraged and guided to accept responsibility for their behavior and performance in training and competition, as well as all aspects of their life.

Set and monitor appropriate boundaries between a working relationship and friendship with my student-athletes. I will not engage in behavior that is

harassing or demeaning to any student-athlete.

Ensure that I am not attempting to exert undue influence over my student-athletes in order to obtain personal gain.

Respect the rights and privacy of my student-athletes by not sharing information that should remain confidential.

Demonstrate high personal standards and a Christ-like image to the student-athletes, parents, fans, officials, coaches and media.

Continue to maintain competence in my sport and ensure a safe environment. I will use careful judgment in protecting the welfare of all student-athletes.

Uphold professional standards of conduct and accept responsibility for my behavior. I will comply with standards and this code of conduct and ask my colleagues to hold me accountable.

SPORTS GUIDELINES - VOLLEYBALL

Central Region Division I

I. ADMINISTRATIVE GUIDELINES FOR REGIONAL TOURNAMENT

A. Date and Site

1. The NCCAA Regional Tournament date needs to be 2-3 weekends preceding the NCCAA National Tournament. The tournament shall not exceed two days.
2. The Regional Tournament site will be rotated, through zones, as regional teams are willing and capable to host. Each host school must have a minimum of two courts in order to host the Regional Tournament. The 2008 Regional Tournament will be hosted by Southwestern Assemblies of God University.
3. The exception to the above guideline shall apply if only two schools are participating at the Regional Tournament. In the case of only two schools participating, the higher seeded school has the option of hosting the tournament.

B. Eligibility (for all teams)

1. An affidavit of eligibility (NCCAA Official Eligibility Certificate) must be on file with the Regional Vice-Chair (Dr. Jerry Boone) and must be postmarked prior to the date of the first competition.

2. Regional and National dues must be paid in order to be eligible.
 3. **A team must not miss more than two statistics report dates. Failure to submit the weekly statistical report more than two times will make your team ineligible for any tournament play (NCCAA Regional or NCCAA National Championship) and will prohibit your players from any post-season award consideration.**
 4. Each team planning on participating in the Regional Tournament must have representation at the Regional meeting. This meeting is held a minimum of two hours prior to the first match of the Regional Tournament. This representative, usually the head coach, must have nominations for the All-Region players (stats would be helpful) and Scholar-Athletes.
- C. Structure
1. The Regional Tournament shall be single elimination, unless otherwise determined by the Regional Representative and the coaches from the participating schools. If there are an odd number of teams participating, the top seeded team will receive a bye in the first round of play. We will vote for twelve (12) All-Region players - voted on in decreasing rank order, eleven (11) All-Region players, and one (1) Regional MVP. The coaches from the participating schools will also vote for the Regional Coach of the Year. Note: Only the top six (6) All-Region players will be forwarded on for consideration as All-Americans at the National Tournament.
- D. Seeding
1. Seeding for the Regional Tournament will be based on three criteria:
 - a. Season Record
 - b. Burbridge Rating (ranking within the NCCAA)
 - c. Record within the Region
- E. Host Institution Responsibilities
1. Assume the following financial obligations:
 - a. Regional Championship Banner (will be sent from the National Office)
 - b. Plaque for the Regional Coach of the Year
 - c. Officials (must be NAGWS/USAV rated)
 - d. Volleyballs (practice balls and game balls for all games)
 - e. Programs (with each participating team's roster)
 2. Inform participating teams of the following:
 - a. Tournament schedule of matches and events

- b. All-Region, All-Tournament and Coach of the Year ballots need to be made up and distributed to each of the coaches of the participating teams at the coaches meeting. This will be coordinated with the help of the Regional Representative.
 - c. Specific policies and service guidelines of the school
 - d. Ask each of the participating schools to send updated team rosters for the program (at least three days prior to the tournament).
 - e. Local food and lodging options
 - 3. Other duties:
 - a. Secure meeting room for coaches meeting (two hours prior to the first match on Friday).
 - b. Assignment of officials - must be NAGWS/USAV rated
 - c. Complete financial expense report must be submitted to the Regional Vice-Chairperson (Jerry Malone).
 - d. All-Region certificates will be made up by the Regional Representative and mailed to the individual schools after the tournament.
- F. Fees
 - 1. A nominal entry fee to assist with the cost of officials, trophies, etc., is to be determined by the host school. This fee is not to exceed \$175 (Remember, the host school does not have expenses for traveling, but will have high costs for officials and awards). In the case where only two schools are participating, both schools will share the officiating costs of the tournament. This fee needs to be announced to the participating schools at least two weeks prior to the event. Schools will then have enough time to submit check requests so that payment can be brought to the Regional Tournament.

II. STATISTICS

- A. Reports
 - 1. The Regional Representative will send a report to Gabe Wallis at the NCCAA National Office listing the All-Region Team, the Regional Coach of the Year and the scores from all of the matches.
 - 2. The host school will need to get all the match scores to the Regional Representative.
- B. All-Region Team and Regional Coach of the Year Selections
 - 1. All-Region player nominations are to be brought to the Regional Tournament. Each coach will have a few minutes to speak on behalf of his/her nominees. If you have any cumulative stats, it would be helpful to bring them with you to the meeting.

2. Coaches will vote for players in decreasing rank order, not to include any players from their own teams. Coaches may not vote for any of their players, but they can leave a blank spot on the ballot where they feel their player(s) belongs in the total ranking.
3. Votes will be tallied and the top twelve (12) will be announced at the conclusion of the championship match. Remember: Only the top six (6) All-Region team members will be eligible for All-American honors.
4. In case of a tie, via ranking, the number of votes will be the tie breaking criteria, followed by the highest rank of votes received.
5. The Regional Coach of the Year will be voted on by the coaches at the Regional Tournament and will be announced at the conclusion of the championship match.

 - 4. Structure
 - a. The playoff will be single elimination.
 - 5. Seeding

SPORTS GUIDELINES - BASEBALL Central Region Division I

I. ADMINISTRATIVE GUIDELINES FOR REGIONAL TOURNAMENT

- A. Date and Site
 1. The Regional Baseball Tournament date will be selected by the Regional Baseball Coaches in conjunction with the Regional Sports Chair. The location will be hosted in rotating zones by schools with the capacity to host the tournament.
- B. Eligibility
 1. An affidavit of eligibility (NCCAA Official Eligibility Certificate) must be on file with the Regional Chair and must be postmarked prior to the date of the first competition.
 2. Regional dues must be paid to the Regional Treasurer prior to September 30.
 3. A team must declare its intent to participate and submit a \$25 regional participation fee to the Regional Sports Chair by March 1.
 4. A team does not have to have a .500 win-loss record in order to participate.
 5. The Revised Hunter System will be used to determine seeding.
- C. Structure
 1. The tournament will be double elimination.
 2. All games will be seven-inning games or be played until a winner is determined.
 3. The tournament format will follow NAIA brackets. A two of three game series will be used if only two teams participate.

4. If the first round of the tournament has not been completed, the tournament will be declared no contest.
 5. If the tournament is declared no contest, a representative from the Central Region for the National Tournament would be selected by the Regional Baseball Committee.
 6. Enforcements: NAIA Speed-up and Tournament Rules (Addendum B), NCAA slide rule.
- D. Seeding
1. Contact will be made by each coach to the Regional Sports Chair on Saturday evening prior to the Tournament.
 2. The Regional Baseball Chair will contact teams as soon as possible.
- E. Host's Responsibilities
1. Assume the following financial obligations:
 - a. Officials
 - b. Baseballs
 - c. Programs
 - d. Hospitality
 - e. Site fee \$25 per participating school given to the Regional Champion
 2. Inform the participating teams of the following:
 - a. Tournament Schedule of Games
 - b. Specific Policies and Service Guidelines of School
 - c. Local food and lodging
 3. Other duties:
 - a. Schedule coaches' meeting prior to the start of the tournament if at all possible
 - b. Scheduling of officials

II. STATISTICS

- A. Reports
1. Baseball statistics are to be submitted weekly to the National SID for the NCCAA.
 2. All-Region Selections
 - a. All Region Selections are to be submitted by completing the D.A.N. Stats form on each player. In order to be eligible for consideration, the participation fee must have been paid. There is no limit to the number of nominations a coach may submit.
 - b. The Regional Baseball Chair will be responsible to collect nominations and conduct the balloting for the NCCAA Central All-Regional Team. Only players with a completed and up to date D.A.N. Statistics form will be included in the balloting. The selections will be made the night preceding the tournament.
 - c. Nominations are due to the Regional Sports Chair no later

- d. than 9:00 AM on the Monday prior to the Regional Tournament.
- d. The All-Region team shall consist of 4 pitchers, 2 catchers, 5 infielders, 4 outfielders, and 2 designated hitters/utility players.
- e. All-Region selections will be eligible for All-American nomination.
- 3. Coach of the Year Selection
 - a. The coach of the Regional Championship team shall be awarded Central Region Coach of the Year.
 - b. The Regional Coach of the Year will be eligible for the National Coach of the Year.
- 4. Tournament Dates:
 - a. May 7-10, 2008 (Wednesday will be used only if the number of teams participating makes it necessary.)
